# **CMS TRIPLE AIM**

The U.S. spends more on healthcare than any other country. Right now, we're spending 18% of our GDP, and that's expected to rise to 20% in the coming years. To combat rising healthcare costs, the Institute for Health Improvement (IHI) introduced the Triple Aim, a framework that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has taken on to help optimize healthcare systems:
